

FSCS is a Professional Learning Community (PLC)


- All students need educational <u>differentiation</u> as a regular part of their school day.
- □ Faithful Shepherd Catholic School uses the Professional Learning Communities (PLC) Model and its four essential questions to guide differentiated instruction.
- Faithful Shepherd Catholic School students have needs that will be met through *shared responsibility* within the educational community.

PLC Essential Questions

- ☐ What do we expect our students to learn? (Targets/I Cans)
- How will we know they are learning? (assessment)
- ☐ How will we respond when they don't learn? (intervention)
- How will we respond if they already know it? (enrichment)

How will we respond if they already know it? K-5 Enrichment Program Services Model

- ☐ The Levels of Service Model is the K-5 Enrichment Program Services Model we use at FSCS.
- We have adapted the Levels of Service (LoS) Model to work with the PLC Model



FSCS Levels of Service Model

Level I = ALL Learners

Providing foundational skills and tools
Field trips, Guest speakers, Independent Interest problems, Push-in lessons

Level II = MANY Learners

Engaging and verifying interests

K-3 Level II Enrichment, After-school clubs and sports, In-class differentiated content, instructional processes and student products

Level III = SOME Learners

Meeting the need for alternative opportunities

Grades 4-5 Level III Reading and Math Enrichment classes, MS Advanced and

Accelerated ELA and Math classes

Level IV = FEW Learners

Need for highly individualized services

 Students in grades 2-8 participate in the
 NWEA MAP standardized assessments in
 Fall, Winter, and Spring
- CogAT Winter
 Students in grades 3 and 5 also will take the
 CogAT standardized assessments in replace of

the Winter NWEA - MAP standardized assessments.

Questions?

- How are students chosen to participate in K-3 level II reading and/or math enrichment?
 - Groups are determined by the classroom teacher, and are flexible, changing each unit or according to students' need.
- How often to students participate in level II reading and/or math enrichment?
 - On average, 1-2x per week for 30 minutes.
- How will I know if my child participates in level II reading and/or math enrichment?
 - Typically, your child will bring home what they worked on in Enrichment.
 - At the end of a unit, there may be a small informational newsletter sent home.
