

## DOUBLING RULE

If your one syllable base word has:

- 1) one short vowel
- 2) ends in one consonant &
- 3) your suffix begins with a vowel

THEN, double the consonant.

1 1 1  
Ex. swim + ing = swimming

(The ones above the letters indicate the three conditions needed for the doubling rule)

Some examples:

1 1 1  
drop + ing = dropping

1 1 1  
mad + est = maddest

1 1 X  
mad + ly = madly

X 1 1  
sweep + ing = sweeping

1X 1  
plant + er = planter

1 1 1  
quit + ing = quitting (\*\* u is q's partner here NOT a voiced vowel)

*Exceptions:*

*Never double W's or X's:*

*snow + ing = snowing*

*box + er = boxer*
