DOUBLING RULE

If your one syllable base word has:

- 1) one short vowel
- 2) ends in one consonant &
- 3) your suffix begins with a vowel

THEN, double the consonant.

$$drop + ing = dropping$$

Exceptions:

Never double W's or X's:

SILENT E RULE

If your word end in a silent e:

- 1) Drop the silent e if the suffix begins with a vowel (-ing, -er, -es, -est, -ed, -y)
- 2) Keep the silent e if the suffix begins with a consonant (-ly, -ful, -less, -ment, -ness)

Y RULE

1) If your word ends in a Y and is preceded by a consonant, change the <u>y</u> to <u>i</u> and add the suffix unless the suffix begins with the letter <u>i</u>.

Example:

copy copies, copied, copier, copying

2) If your word ends in a Y and is preceded by a vowel, do NOT change the y to i.

Example:

play plays, player, played, playful, playing
