

Third Grade Review - October 29, 2021



Language Arts: Two weeks ago, we read the story "Destiny's Gift". It was a realistic fiction story about getting involved to help a cause. This week we read the story "Pop's Bridge". It was a historical fiction piece about the building of the Golden Gate Bridge in San Francisco. Next week we will begin reading some novels in literature circles. We will put into practice some of the comprehension skills we have been working on so far this year.

Skills: silent e rule with endings, y rule with endings, antonyms, word families

Comprehension Skills: understanding characters, compare/contrast

English Skills: compound, complex and run-on sentences; test on Thursday, Nov. 4th; review sheet coming home on Wednesday.

Cursive: We began learning our first letters - i, t, u, and w

Math: We worked with addition targets:

- 1. I can solve number sentences that involve addition basic facts and unknowns.
- 2. I can round and estimate whole numbers to solve real world and mathematical problems.
- 3. I can add whole numbers to the thousands.
- 4. I can decide if an estimate or an exact answer is needed to solve a problem.

We finished our place value unit and are now learning about different addition properties. We practiced and used activities to learn how to carry numbers/regroup in addition problems. Next week we will look at problems with larger numbers and learn clues how to decide whether we need an exact answer or an estimated answer.

Social Studies: Two weeks ago, we learned about what a citizen is and what some our responsibilities are. We also read about how citizens can help one another and work for the common good. Then we began learning about government. We learned about the three branches of government: legislative, executive, and judicial. We then learned about local governments including who runs them and what are their duties. This week we learned about the leaders and duties of state and national government. We reviewed some of what we learned by watching a couple Brainpopjr videos. We will be taking a government test next Wednesday, November 3rd. Look for a review to come home on Monday. You will have 2 days to study.

Religion: We researched our saints. We created final drafts of facts they learned as well as a symbol and drawing of their saint. We will be sharing them next week. They will then be displayed in the hall. Next week we will begin using our religion books. The students will now be having a religion test most Tuesdays, and will be reviewing the chapter for homework on Monday nights and completing a review page in their workbooks.
