

## Third Grade Review - October 7, 2021



Language Arts: Last week we read the first story in our basal reader. It was called "A Fine, Fine School" and was a humorous fiction story about a principal who loved his kids and teachers so much that he had an interesting idea to make the school even better. See if your child can tell you what it was! This week we read "The Trial of Cardigan Jones". It was a fantasy about a character being unjustly accused of a crime. We also worked on writing constellation stories.

*Skills*: context clues, using a dictionary, ow sound, ng and nk words, 111 doubling rule words *Comprehension Skills*: story structure, drawing conclusions

English Skills: commands and exclamations, the subject and predicate of a sentence

Math: We worked with place value targets:

1. I can compare numbers up to the hundred thousand's place. 2. I can order numbers up to the hundred thousand's place 3. I can round numbers up to the ten thousand's place. 4. I can use a bar graph to solve a problem.

This week we did some activities to help us compare and order numbers up to the hundred thousands. We also began work on rounding to the tens, and hundreds. Next week we will round to the thousands and ten thousands as well, and then learn how to gather information from a bar graph.

**Science:** To finish our Sun, Moon and Earth unit we are doing a STEM project. The kids are using the engineering design process to solve the problem of a school playground being too hot and having damaging UV rays shining on us. They built models of solutions to that problem and we tested them for UV rays. It was a lot of fun and the kids showed a lot of creativity.

**Religion:** Standing up for oneself was the next lesson in our "Steps to Respect" curriculum. We practiced standing up for oneself by using an assertive voice. We role modeled how to be assertive and how to refuse to be bullied as well as how to report bullying to a teacher.
