



[&]A Week in Review - September 24, 2021

Language Arts: This week we began working in our English Grammar books. We began learning about sentences. We also took our reading and language arts NWEA tests.

Skills: words with oo, ar, wh and oy,

English Skills: identifying sentences vs. fragments, statements vs. questions

Math: We worked with place value targets:

1. I can find place and value of digits up to the 6th digit.

2. I can represent whole numbers to 100,000 in a variety of ways.

3. I can read and write numbers up to 100,000.

This week we have been involved in activities centered on place value. We have worked with numbers up in to the ten thousands. They learned how to write the standard, expanded, and word form of those types of numbers as well as finding the place and value of certain digits. Next week we will learn about hundred thousands and then do some reviewing. We will take our place value I test on **Friday**, **October 1**st. Look for a review to come home the night before.

Science: We continued our space unit by learning about the moon and its phases. We also learned about stars and their patterns. The students will be working on creating a "new" constellation and writing a story that explains why it exists. Next week we will review and test. Look for the review packet on Tuesday, September 28th and the test will be Thursday, September 30th.

Religion: We did the next two "Steps to Respect" lessons. This week we learned "Joining In". We did some role playing again and included what to do if we are told no, we can't join. Then we did the first bullying lesson "Recognizing Bullying" and learned the definition of bullying. We looked at situations to decide if it really was bullying or just someone being mean.
